

Dear Colleagues,

Metro has always maintained that it would follow expert advice in the rapidly evolving global health pandemic that is COVID-19.

This afternoon, the State Government announced that everyone living in metro Melbourne and Mitchell Shire are now recommended to wear face masks in situations where they are leaving their home and social/physical distancing is not guaranteed. This also applies to people entering metro Melbourne and Mitchell Shire for one of the four reasons, such as work.

This comes as Victoria records 288 new coronavirus cases in the last 24 hours – the single biggest spike in cases nationally since the pandemic started.

At Metro, this means:

- Where you cannot guarantee a 1.5 metre social/physical distance, including in your workplace, you should wear a mask.
- You should continue to social/physical distance where you can, even if you are wearing a mask.
- Metro will supply the colleagues who need masks, with masks. Speak to your leader about the process in your workplace for accessing masks.
- It's a recommendation this is not mandated but rather advisory in nature.
- First and foremost people who are unwell should not come to work and should get tested.
- If healthy people need to travel and social distancing cannot be guaranteed, they are advised to wear a mask. This, again, is a request and we won't be asking colleagues to enforce this among passengers.
- Public transport remains an essential service.
- Those colleagues who can do their role at home, should remain working at home.
- This comes into effect immediately.
