

Dear Colleagues,

With COVID-19 numbers tracking in a positive direction, Premier Daniel Andrews announced a series of changes yesterday.

The changes include the return to face-to-face learning for all primary school aged children from October 12, tighter rules on face masks and the end to Melbourne's night curfew, which means the return to our regular timetable. Our teams are working closely with colleagues at the Department of Transport on a plan around this at the moment.

The Premier also announced that Melburnians will need to wear a fitted mask that covers both the nose and mouth. He said concessions, including the use of face shields, would no longer apply. If you are on the frontline, your leader will be in touch shortly with more information to assist you. While there is a two week grace period for enforcement, we encourage you to wear a fitted face mask immediately if you are able to.

With every set of new changes there are always mixed emotions. It is, however, important to remember what we are all working towards. It is promising that Melbourne is heading in the right direction. I thank you all for continually following the rules and working as One Team towards success here.

Attached is the most recent State Government roadmap so you can understand more about how the changes impact on you.

METROPOLITAN MELBOURNE – THE SECOND STEP



Changes apply from 11:59pm Sunday, 27 September 2020.

Density requirements, cleaning, signage and record keeping requirements continue to apply for many of these venues and facilities

Reasons to leave your home	Stay home unless Shopping for essential goods (1 person per household, once a day, within 5km of home) Caregiving or compassionate reasons Work or education (if a permitted worker or learner) Exercise (2 hours per day within 5km from home, and can drive to undertake exercise) Other specified reasons (specific exemptions apply) Intrastate travel: not allowed unless for permitted purpose Local Government elections: can leave home for letterboxing as a candidate, employee or volunteer	 Stay at home unless: Shopping for essential goods (No limit to the number of people from one household that can leave to shop for necessary goods or services so long as group aligns with public gathering requirements). Face shields on their own do not meet these requirements. There will be a two-week grace period in enforcement. End of life: A terminally ill person plus up to 10 people or a household can meet outdoors, attend entertainment or a recreation venue. Children under 12 months of age are excluded from the limit. This will be signed off by the CHO or the DCHO in each individual case. Resting place: A person may attend the resting place (a cemetery or columbarium) of a deceased relative for remembering a key milestone (e.g. birthday, date of death, anniversary). Exempt from the 5km rule, but can only travel to the resting place if it is within metropolitan Melbourne and must observe gathering requirements. Gathering limits are a household or up to five people from a maximum of two households.
