Dear Colleagues,

Updated circuit-breaker restrictions now apply for Melbourne and Regional Victoria.

These measures, announced by **Acting Premier James Merlino** earlier this week, are designed to keep everyone safe and put us on the path to a strong recovery.

In addition to my previous communication, attached to this email, please note the following updates:

Victoria's COVID-19 vaccine roll-out

Metro is urging all colleagues who are eligible to consider the opportunity to get vaccinated, in keeping with the current public health advice.

In Victoria, the COVID-19 vaccine roll-out is managed through the Department of Health. Metro does not operate its own COVID-19 vaccine program.

For the latest public health advice, we encourage all employees to visit coronavirus.vic.gov.au

This site features all available options for Victorians to book and receive a COVID-19 vaccine.

This includes Metro colleagues over the age of 40 – and those who qualify under a provision for frontline Transport workers. Colleagues eligible under this provision have also received separate communications.

The Department of Health advises that COVID-19 vaccines are safe – and that people should speak with their GP, should they have any questions.

One of Victoria's COVIDSafe principles is for businesses to keep good records and be able to act quickly if an employee becomes unwell or has visited a designated <u>exposure site</u>.
