Subject: Message from Rob: COVIDSafe settings to be eased further in Victoria



Dear Colleagues,

Acting Premier James Merlino has announced a further easing of circuit-breaker restrictions in Victoria.

This means **from 11:59pm Thursday** (tomorrow):

Metropolitan Melbourne

- The 25km travel limit will be removed
- Public gatherings will be allowed for up to 20 people
- Private gatherings will be allowed with a maximum of two people per day
- Gyms, and indoor entertainment venues can open
- Office workers can return to a 50 per cent cap; at Metro, for now, those who can work from home should continue to do so – see below for more information.

Regional Victoria

Public gatherings increased to 50 people

All of Victoria

- Face masks will still need to be carried at all times and worn whenever:
 - inside (when not at home);
 - on public transport; and
 - wherever physical distancing cannot be maintained;

except where recognised exemptions apply.

• COVIDSafe return to corporate offices:

Metro is now reviewing our workforce bubble model for corporate offices. While we will have more to say in due course, the bubble model remains on hold for now. People who can work from home should continue to do so, until further advised.
