

Dear Colleagues,

Acting Premier James Merlino has announced a further easing of circuit-breaker restrictions in Victoria.

This means from 11:59pm Thursday (tomorrow) for a two-week period:

Metropolitan Melbourne

- Movement between Metropolitan Melbourne and Regional Victoria unrestricted.
- Travel to regional Victorian Alpine Resorts permitted with conditions.

All of Victoria

- Face masks will still need to be carried at all times and worn whenever:
 - inside (when not at home);
 - on public transport; and
 - wherever physical distancing cannot be maintained;

except where recognised exemptions apply – see below for more information regarding Metro operational employees.

- Private gatherings in the home: limited to **15 visitors** per day together or separately, including dependants (infants under 12 months not included in the cap).
- Public gatherings will be allowed for up to **50 people**.
- Office workers can return to a **75 per cent cap** see below for more information regarding Metro returning to office employees.
- Changes to density limits for events, including weddings and funerals.

Please remember:

- COVIDSafe return to corporate offices:
 Employees can continue to work from home for now, however are now also able to go back into the office. If employees are going into the office they must wear a mask while inside.
- Strong COVIDSafe settings remain in place in all Metro workplaces: In addition to our existing internal check-in systems, the Service Victoria QR Code system will be in place across Metro workplaces by 1 July. Please continue to practise the COVID-Safe behaviours and plans designed to keep everyone safe and Victoria on track for a strong recovery.
- For our Operations and Passenger Delivery workplaces:

- Face masks **must be worn indoors**. This includes office environments, depots and in Metro vehicles.
- Face masks are **not mandatory when you are outdoors**, as long as you can stay 1.5 metres away from others. If you are unable to remain physically distanced, you must wear a mask.
- Face masks remain mandatory on public transport.
- Face masks may be a source of distraction when driving so **Train Drivers can choose** whether to wear a mask whilst driving. There is a maximum of three people in the train cab and the person at the controls can choose whether to wear a mask or not, all other people in the cab must wear a mask.
- You must carry a mask with you at all times when outside in the open air, and be ready to wear it when you cannot stay 1.5 metres physically distanced.
- Vaccines now available to eligible Victorians:

The Department of Health has advised available COVID-19 vaccines are safe. We urge all colleagues who are eligible to consider the opportunity to get vaccinated.
