DESCRIPTION

This course is to provide the underpinning knowledge and skills for Rail Safety Workers (RSWs) to fulfil the role of a **Track Force Protection Coordinator (TFPC) 3.1** on the Metro Trains Melbourne (MTM) Metropolitan Rail Network.

AUDIENCE

This course MUST be undertaken by Rail Safety Workers wanting to perform the duties of a **TFPC 3.1** on the MTM Metropolitan Rail Network.

This course is not suitable if participant has already attained the **TFPC 3.1** competency from a <u>non-approved MTM training</u> <u>provider</u> and is not approved to work on the MTM Metropolitan Rail Network.

The **TFPC 3.1 (MTM Conversion Course)** is required if the above applies.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

This course will give participants the knowledge and skills to:

- Undertake track assessment plan track protection required to perform work activity safely
- Use hand signal commands to manage rail traffic
- Access and interpret information about track protection requirements
- · Carry out assigned protection and/or work activities
- Respond appropriately to abnormal situations

PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE) REQUIREMENTS

Participants MUST bring the following items on the day of training:



Rail Approved Orange Hi-Vis vest Eye protection Hard hat

Participants cannot commence training without PPE

PROOF OF IDENTITY REQUIREMENTS

Participants are required to produce a valid Identification document (ID) on the day of training.

One of the following is considered a valid ID document, the document must contain a photo of the participant and be current.

- Australian or International Passport
- Driver's Licence
- Driver's Learners Permit
- Boat Operator's Licence
- Victorian Firearm Licence
- Licence to Perform High Risk Work
- Consumer Affairs Victoria Proof of Age card
- Other Australian Government issued ID card
- State, Territory or Federal Government Employee ID
- Keypass ID card or Tertiary Education Photo ID card

METRO ACADEMY PREREQUISITES

Participant MUST be 18+ years of age

Participant MUST have completed the approved MTM **Lookout** course and held that competency for a minimum of six months

Participant MUST have been issued the following unit/s of competency:

TLIF0020 Safely access the rail corridor*

TLIF0027 Perform lookout duties*

Participant MUST have current employment with an organisation that is working within the MTM Metropolitan Rail Network and,

- A <u>pre-requisite declaration</u> completed by the participant and their employer, declaring that they meet the pre-requisite requirements of the course and the associated evidence specified in the A1626 'Work on Track' Safeworking Competency Management Procedure,
- A current Rail Industry Worker (RIW) card / MTM Track Protection card.

The pre-requisite declaration must be submitted to <u>railsafetyprereq@metrotrains.com.au</u> a minimum five (5) days before scheduled class attendance to allow for verification to occur.

* (Units of competency considered equivalent on www.training.gov.au are also accepted)

METRO ACADEMY PREREQUISITE VERIFICATION

Approved photo ID MUST be sighted on day of attendance.

Metro Academy will verify prerequisites and the participant's evidence against the Rail Industry Worker (RIW), Access & Resource Management System (ARMS), and Work on Track Applications (WOTA) databases prior to attending the training.

To prevent delay, participant's 'The Platform' profile MUST contain current email address, contact number, RIW number and date of birth.

Verifications will be completed by Metro Academy normally within five (5) business days of receipt of information.

* Participants are unable to commence training until verifications have been completed

COURSE COMPLETION

The **MTM TFPC 3.1** competency is **NOT** issued at completion of the **TFPC 3.1** training.

Participants will need to complete the **TFPC 3.1 evidence shifts** within ninety (90) days of completing the training.

Participants who successfully complete all requirements of this course including the infield requirement will be awarded a Statement of Attainment (SoA) for the following nationally recognised unit/s of competency and a Certificate of Completion (CoC):

TLIF0023 Conduct track protection assessment

TLIW0007 Operate under track protection rules

SoA and CoC will be issued by Metro Academy via email, normally within ten (10) business days.

The CoC competency is accepted on the MTM Metropolitan Rail Network and is valid for 24 months. This competency MUST be renewed before expiration.

RIW CERTIFICATE UPLOADS

Metro Academy will upload the participant's certificate to the RIW database.

To prevent delay, participant's 'The Platform' profile MUST contain current email address, contact number, RIW number and date of birth.

Uploads will be completed by Metro Academy, normally within two (2) business days of SoA and CoC being issued.

INFORMATION/BOOKINGS

This course closes five (5) business days prior to scheduled class attendance to allow for the pre-requisite checks to be completed.
